Jim's Jottings

"REMEMBER YOUR BAPTISM AND BE THANKFUL"

This Sunday is both the Sunday closest to *Epiphany* - the celebration of Jesus being revealed to the Gentiles, and the Sunday dedicated to remembering the baptism of Jesus by John. While these may seem like two entirely different observances, for those of us on the Gentile side of the church, they are inextricably linked.

Because in Jesus the intent of God to save the whole world was made plain, we who, in the words of the Apostle Paul, "were . . . without Christ, . . . having no hope and without God in the world, . . . are no longer strangers and aliens, but [we] are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God." {Ephesians 2:12, 19} Our baptism is a sign and seal, through the Holy Spirit, of our incorporation into the people of God.

In Romans, Paul reminds us that our baptism reminds us of the fundamental nature of our life in Christ: "Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life." [Romans 6:4] Not only have we been incorporated into the people of God, we have been reborn, re-created into new people after the fashion of Jesus Christ.

When Jesus was baptized by John, according to this Sunday's Gospel passage, as he came out of the water, the heaven's opened and God spoke, "This is my Son, the Beloved, . . ." Our baptism reminds us that we are more than just part of a people or institution. By being baptized into Christ, we share in his relationship

Reservations Required

Wednesday Fellowship Meals resume this coming Wednesday at 5:30 p.m. Several changes in our Fellowship Meal will take place as we begin the new year:

- ⇒ The meals will be catered by Goose Creek Diner;
- ⇒ The price will increase from \$6.00 to \$10.00;
- ⇒ Reservations will be required, and can be made by using sign-up sheets available on Sunday or by calling the church office at 502-425-7150
- ⇒ Reservations made but not kept will be charged to you the next time you come;
- ⇒ Standing Reservations can be made, but you are responsible for cancelling by Monday at Noon for a reservation you cannot keep.

Most of these changes are necessary because we have engaged Goose Creek Diner, and like any caterer they charge us based on the number of meals we order for any given Wednesday.

We operate our Wednesday Fellowship Meal ministry on a cash pass-through basis. That is, we pay for the program by the money paid for reservations made. If we order more meals than are eaten/paid for, then the money to pay for those meals comes from other program areas of the budget.

The renewal of this ministry will enhance our fellowship and community.

- ◇ Providing Hearing-Assist devices for worshippers.

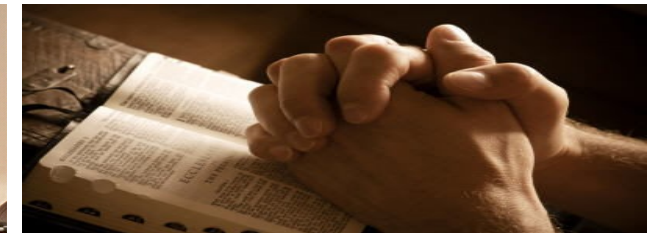
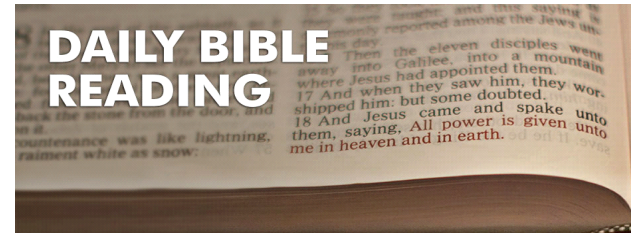
We hope you will be able to participate in this significant meeting in the life of our church. It is a great time to not only learn what is going on, but to help shape our life and ministry going forward.
