We are pleased to make room for this service again this year.



or death events, do we? Yet, in one important
aspect they are.

Whenever we gather to hear the Scriptures taught, read, and/or proclaimed, we are once again brought face-to-face with God's neverending love and faithfulness. We are reminded that God has done for us what we could not do for ourselves -- freed us from the chains of sin and death that would destroy our lives. We are confronted with the Covenant God offers us in Jesus Christ, wherein God becomes our God and we become God's people.

At the conclusion of every Bible study or worship service, we are confronted with an altar call; an altar call not that much different from the one Moses offered Israel.

One of the most dramatic scenes in all of Scripture is described in this Sunday's Old Testament Lesson - Deuteronomy 30:15-20.

Throughout the whole of Deuteronomy, Moses has been recounting the history of Israel's encounter with God. He begins by reminding them why they wandered in the wilderness until the first generation of freed slaves died off because of their refusal to trust that the God who delivered them from slavery in Egypt could deliver them into the Promised Land.

From that point, Moses goes on to weave the Covenant Commandments with the story of their wandering. He reminds them that at every twist and turn in the story that God has always been faithful to God's promises. But he also reminds them that God does not act in isolation, but in concert with the faithful response of the people to God's Covenant.

Moses closes his recitation with an altar call of sorts. Now, to understand this power of this altar call, we must remember where the book of Deuteronomy begins -- the people are gathered on the banks of the Jordan River, on the cusp of entering the Promised Land. Moses reminds them that they have been here before, and that time the story ended in disaster, because the people failed to trust in the never-ending faithfulness of God.

Standing on, or near, the place where God pronounced judgement on Israel's lack of faith, Moses challenges this new generation not to make the same mistake that their parents made.

Yet, he reminds them that they are presented with the same choice: *life or death.*
