In preparation for entering into the Lenten Season, I would like to take a moment and briefly preview each of these disciplines:

- ◇ PRAYER - While we often think of prayer as taking our requests to God, Rosalind Rinker, in her book by the same name, reminds us that prayer is “conversation with God.” Richard Foster’s classic book on Prayer is subtitled “Finding the Heart’s True Home.” Prayer, he writes, is our true, genuine response to love.
- ◇ FASTING - We tend to identify fasting with sacrifice, but essentially fasting is making room in our lives by removing something that occupies space belonging to God. When we fast, we find time and space for prayer, reconciliation, almsgiving and penance.
- ◇ PENANCE - This is a strange word for Baptists, and indeed most Protestants, for we tend to connect it with the Catholic practice of Confession. Thus we avoid it as an empty ritual. But taking time to reflect on those times and places where we have strayed from the path of discipleship and to own our culpability in the harm we have done to others, either actively or passively, is an important, necessary step to growing in Christ.
- ◇ SACRIFICE - Everything in our culture is about ‘me’ and what’s in it for ‘me.’ The heart of Christian discipleship is reaching out to another in the name of Jesus; extending the love of Christ, especially to someone we would rather not deal with. That takes sacrifice of our ego, our comfort, etc.
- ◇ RECONCILIATION - Our Gospel lesson last Sunday reminded us of how seriously God takes our being in right relationship with each other. Lent can be a time where we do the hard work of mending broken relationships.
- ◇ ALMSGIVING - Historically this meant giving to help the poor and the downcast. Sharing our money, letting go of our possessions for the welfare of others.

I believe that if we are willing to engage these disciplines as individuals and a church, we will open ourselves to God’s renewing Spirit among us.

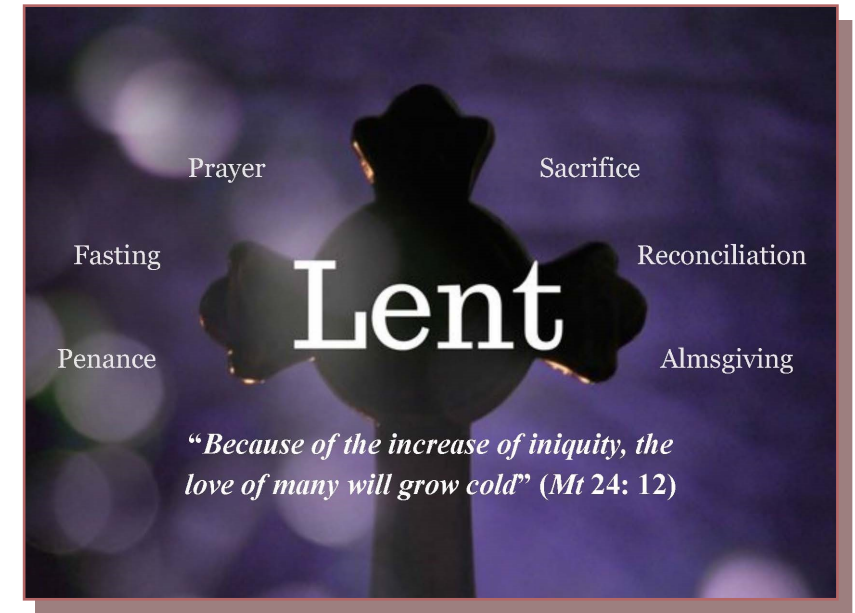

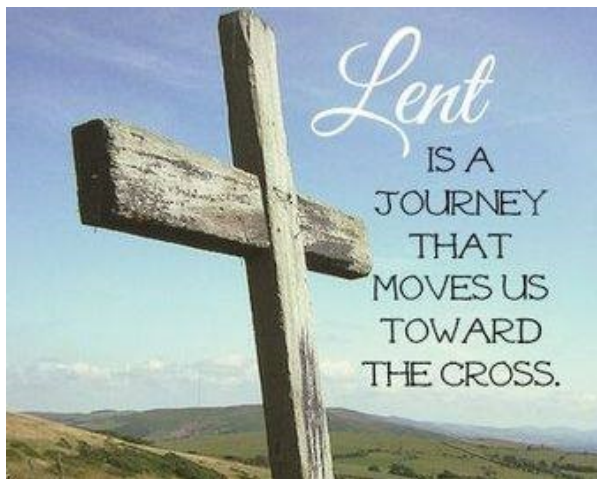

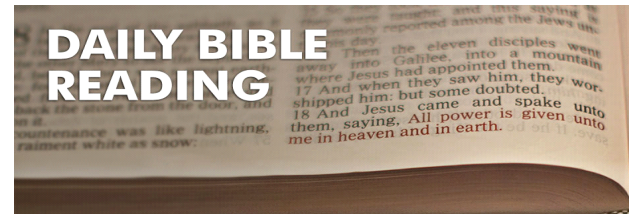
