Jim's Jottings

“Yet even now, says the LORD, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing.”

-Joel 2:12-13

Fasting has a long history as a spiritual practice. The people of God have turned to fasting for a variety of reasons. Most common among them have been repentance and seeking guidance for making important decisions.

In the passage from Joel, quoted above, God seems to be the one calling the people to a period of fasting and mourning for their sins. Implicit in this call is the admonishment not to make a public display, but to make it a matter of their hearts. This seems to echo the words of Jesus, “And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, . . . But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others, but by your Father who sees in secret. . . .”

Fasting, at its heart, is not some public display of piety, but a time of approaching God with no agenda of our own other than to seek God’s agenda for our lives, not just as individuals, but as the people of God. Fasting is a practice that involves making space for God and God’s voice. We do that tangibly by removing those things that we hunger for, that we long for that keep us from experiencing God. Fasting confronts us with the reality that we do not live by bread alone, but every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. When we fast, we turn our longing to God.

In the book of Isaiah we encounter another aspect of fasting: “Is not this the fast I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, ad bring the homeless into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?” [Isaiah 58:6-7]

A true fast is not just about seeking God, it involves a kind of social reorientation. Not only do we turn our eyes toward God, but we turn our eyes toward our neighbor and seek to make real God’s love; or as Jesus said, ‘to proclaim good news to the poor.’

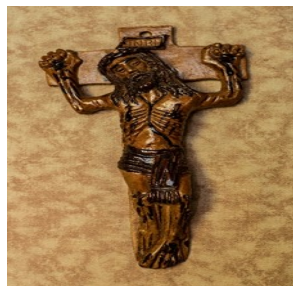

Williams Center for the Cross Invitation

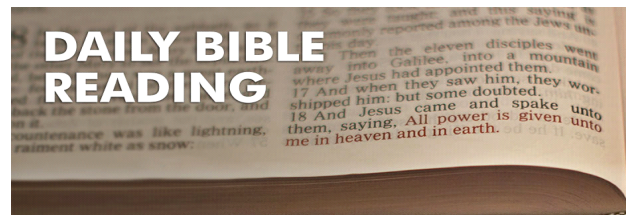
