Penance is a practice that many of us association with the Roman Catholic rite of Confession. In that rite, a person enters the confessional, enumerates the different ways they have sinned since their last confession, receives absolution from the priest, and is usually given something to do as a demonstration of their commitment to do their best to avoid engaging in those sins/that sin again.

Because Martin Luther and the other leaders of the Reformation were repulsed by the abuses related to the Sacrament of Confession, among others,

they tended to downplay and/or dismiss the rite of confession one's sins to a priest in order to receive forgiveness..

One, not trivial, consequence of purging the practice of confessing one's sin to another member of the body of Christ is that many persons are left struggling with sin, shame, and guilt. Even though we might pray, in the privacy of our own heart, for forgiveness, we can often be left wondering if God has heard and forgiven, because we still feel bad and we wonder what has changed.

Another possible consequence may be exactly the Reformers were trying to avoid, i.e. the trivialization of our confession. That is, we come to believe that just the mere act of saying sorry fixes everything. So we can end up in an endless cycle of sin, confession, sin, confession, and on and on, without actually breaking the cycle of sin in our lives.

The writer of The Epistle of James encourages us to "confess [our] sins to one another. . . , so that [we] may be healed.

One way the Protestant Reformers tried to reclaim the act of confession our sins to one another was by including a communal prayer of confession in our worship services. As a community act, and a model for confession, I believe this is a significant part of worship. But it can be a hit or miss experience in our own personal lives, in addressing the struggles we individually have with sin.

The vulnerable act of opening up to another believer about the sin we struggle with can be a path toward healing. At its best, this practice gives us both an accountability partner, and also an ally in the struggles with the sins that are particular to us. It can also help us to identify and confront sins that we have buried deep within our souls.

You may be asking yourself at this point, 'so what is penance, and what does it have to do with confession?'

Penance is tied to confession in this way: when we confess our struggles with sin and our failures, we hear the words from another Christian assuring us of God's forgiveness through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus; but that is not the end of the matter.

For confession to be more than words, the act of penance means we agree to take certain steps that show our determination to avoid engaging in this sin again. That is penance. It could be a simple as determining to say The Lord's Prayer whenever we feel tempted or as radical as Zacchaeus' act of making restitution to those harmed.
