Giving aid and comfort to the poor is a practice deeply embedded in the life of the people of God. In numerous places in the Torah, God explicitly commands the people of Israel to take care of widows, orphans, strangers, and others who represent the lower rung of the social and economic order. The command to provide for the poor is grounded in the very nature of God and the grace given to Israel: "For the LORD your God is God of gods, . . . Who executes justice for the orphan and the widow, and who loves the strangers providing them food and clothing. You shall also love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt." [Deuteronomy 10:17-19]

The early church in Jerusalem took seriously this command to take care of the widow and orphan by building into its very life a systematic, daily distribution of food to them. Some scholars have suggested that the church shifted the practice of almsgiving from an individual or family concern to a community concern for the whole church. Thus a hallmark of the Jerusalem church was the willingness of each and every member to make their resources available to those in the church who had need.

The Apostle Paul, while not teaching a lot about almsgiving, did take up an offering among the mostly Gentile churches to give aid to the church in Jerusalem.

By the end of the first century of the church, the practice of aiding the poor moved beyond the bounds of the church to the larger community. When the plague hit Rome, for example, many Romans marveled that Christians were willing to stay behind to assist and comfort those who could not afford to flee.

Often the discussion of almsgiving and charity to the poor gets caught up in a discussion of who is worthy and who is not; we find ourselves trying to discern the motives and worth of people before we provide aid. Perhaps Lent is a good time for us to be reminded that almsgiving, as an act of love and charity reflective of the nature of God, depends not

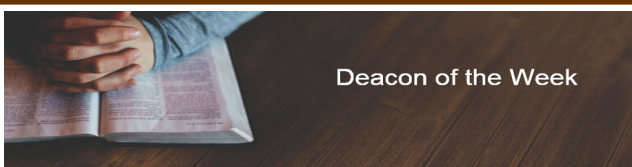

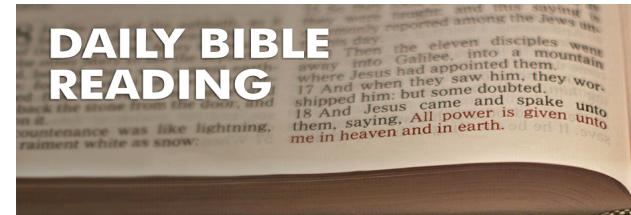
The practice of giving alms, freely and not grudgingly, keeps us in tune with God's compassion.
