Every Summer, the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship sponsors *Extreme Build*, during which a home is built in less than two weeks for a family in one of the poorest areas of Kentucky.

Begun as a part of the Rural Poverty Initiative of the national Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, this local endeavor has built 17 houses for residents of McCreary County, in partnership with Highland Housing, a non-profit housing development group in Eastern Kentucky. Volunteers from Kentucky, Tennessee, and other places come to make this project work.

But more than building a house, this two-week project pumps needed income into the area as volunteers stay in local hotels, eat at local restaurants, and purchase materials from local merchants.

COMING ON WEDNESDAYS THIS SUMMER! A Church-wide Study on Being A Disciple Community

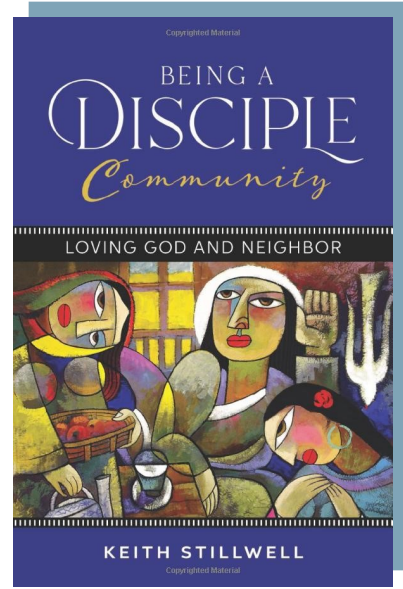
Keith Stillwell served for over 30 years as an Associate Pastor for Spiritual Formation and Missions. Today he is *Together for Hope's* regional vice-president for Appalachia. In 2022, Keith published Being A Disciple Community.

Based on a study of Luke 10:25-42, as well as Keith's experience in the local church, this book explores the eight "loving God and neighbor practices" of community, worship, teaching, prayer, witness, care, and leadership.. Each chapter begins with a conversation Keith has with The Good Samaritan and Mary (of Mary and Martha fame).

Our study will take place in two venues. Our primary venue will be our Wednesday evening meal and service time. As we eat around the tables, we will engage in conversation and study of each chapter in the book. This meeting will be available on Zoom for those who cannot be physically present. This will give you an opportunity to not only listen in on the teaching and conversation, but engage in small group dialogue as Zoom participants.

The second venue will be a Facebook Live conversation that I will lead. This will be available for those who cannot participate in either way on Wednesdays, as well as being a resource for those who attend on Wednesday but want further engagement.

Copies of the book will be available soon at a cost of \$20. While you can participate without the book, to get the most out of the study and to allow the material to be speak to you and to us as a church, we are encouraging each

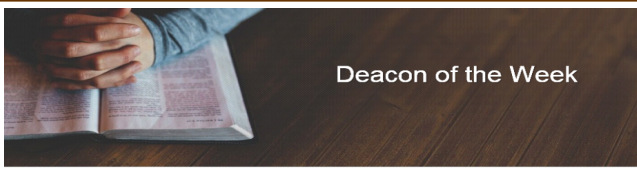

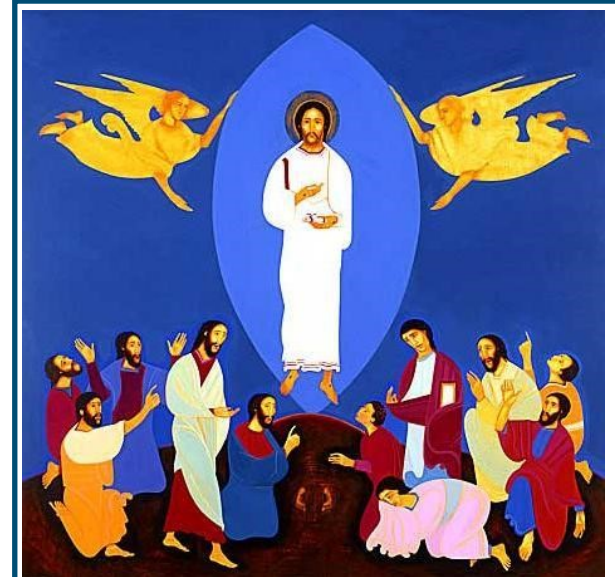

ASCENSION DAY WORSHIP Thursday, May 18 - 12:00 Noon

Situated 40 days after the Resurrection and 10 days prior to Pentecost, the *Day of the Ascension* marks a significant transition in God's ministry to redeem humanity and restore the world. Two movements punctuate this day.

The first movement is Jesus' ascension to take his place at the right hand of God. The resurrection appearances come to an end as Jesus assumes his ministry of intercession on behalf of the church and the world. From his position as the "exalted One," he will pour out the Holy Spirit upon the disciples.

The second movement belongs to the disciples. They, reluctantly, leave the place of Jesus' ascension and return to Jerusalem to await the coming of the promised Holy Spirit.

Between the Ascension and Pentecost, the church adopts a stance of prayer and waiting, preparing for the empowerment Jesus promises.

As a new addition to our worship life this year, we will gather at Noon on May 18th to mark this important milestone in the church's life.

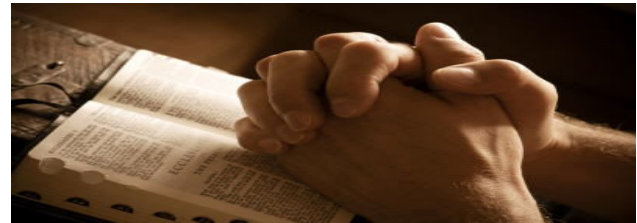
