To be reminded of the interconnectedness of our lives, we need look no further than the extent of the polluting smoke from the wildfires raging out of control in Canada. The smoky haze, which poses a danger to all persons, but especially those with underlying respiratory issues, has stretched down the eastern side of the U. S. all the way to the Georgia-Florida border. Even Louisville has not escaped. As I write this on Friday, our air quality is in the Orange, meaning it is not safe persons with sensitive respiratory systems to spend time outdoors.

Events like this remind us that, though we live hundreds, even thousands of miles from persons and events, our lives are integrally connected.

As I was driving into the church office this morning, I was listening to a report on the Colorado River and the negotiations among the several states and Native American Nations about how to handle the dwindling water resource that river provides to much of the western part of our nation. Much of the current situation is a direct result of climate change, which has reduced rainfall, the growing demands of the agricultural sector, and the rapid expansion of urban areas -- all of which are the result of human activity and its impact on the environment.

On my trip to Kansas last week, I crossed both the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers. I was shocked and how low the water level was in both of these major waterways. Experts point out that serious reductions in the flow of the Mississippi will have a negative impact on the ability to ship products from mid-America to other parts of the nation and world.

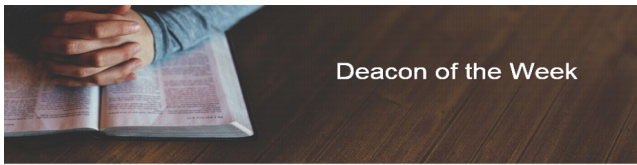

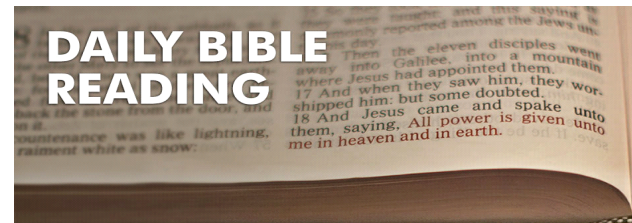
NEEDED LAUNDRY AND PERSONAL CARE ITEMS:

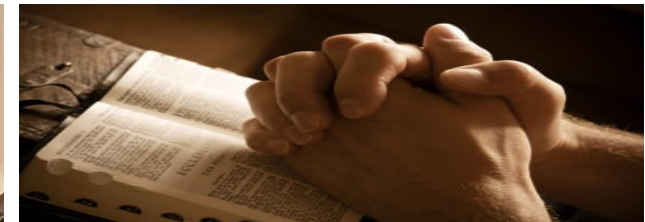
