Jim's Jottings

I am grateful to have been able to take some time earlier this month to go on a private, silent retreat. The Sisters of Loretto, whose Motherhouse is just south of Bardstown, have created a wonderful space in the woods for quiet prayer, contemplation, and reading.

When I say quiet, I don't mean silent, because the woods are anything but silent. In the morning I was treated to the sounds of geese honking down by the pond and crows calling to each other from who-knows-where in the woods. Every afternoon, in a tree right outside of the porch, a squirrel would sit on a limb and gnaw on acorns. What earlier in the day, I had assumed was insects chirping, I came to realize was, at least in part, the sound of squirrel teeth rubbing on acorns. Who knew?!?

While I did not go to do church-work, per se—that is, I did not go to do sermon preparation or any planning for worship or church programs—I did spend time praying for you and for our church. My prayer then, as it always is, was that God would help us to be faithful to the call God has given us as a particular fellowship of God's people in the world. I prayed that God will give us courage, strength, and wisdom to be witnesses of God's love in everything we do.

One day, while I was praying and listening, I found myself voicing this petition to God:

*May our church be a witness to your peace, O God;
may we be a vehicle through which your shalom comes into the lives of those around us—to our community, our world.*

May we be a haven of rest for the weary.

May we be a house of prayer for all people.

I do not claim any particular divine revelation through those words, not would I assume that my prayer needs to be your prayer. But as I reflected on this prayer, I realized it resonated in the depth of my being. It reflects who I am, who I believe God has called me to be.

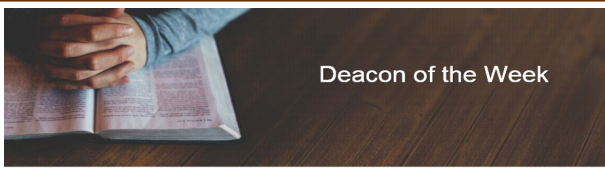

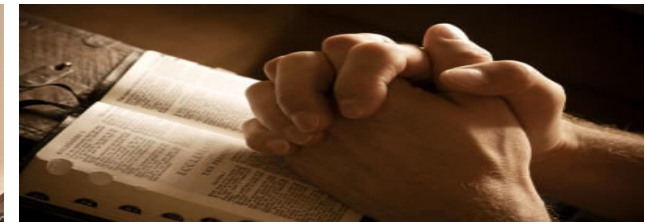
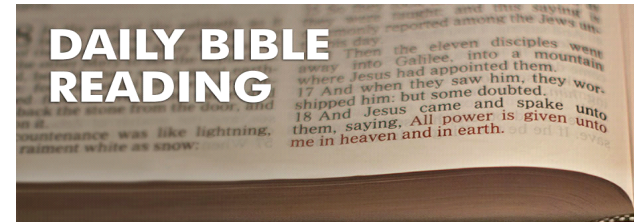
