"I have a very strong conviction that Christians should be known for being odd," says J. Daniel Kirk in his commentary <u>Romans for Normal People</u>. While I have no doubt that Christians are looked at in our time as being odd, I am also sure that Kirk has something else in mind.

The Apostle Paul, in this Sunday's Epistle Reading (Romans 12:9-21) counsels us to live oddly in this world. Among the odd things he urges us to do are:

- ⇒ Outdo each other in showing honor;
- ⇒ Rejoice in hope, be patient in affliction;
- \Rightarrow Pursue hospitality to strangers;
- ⇒ Bless those who persecute us;
- ⇒ Associate with the lowly;
- ⇒ Do not return evil for evil;
- ⇒ As far as it depends on you, live peaceably with everyone;
- ⇒ Never avenge yourself.

And then we come to the end of the passage, where Paul seems to have saved the biggest challenge of all: "... If your enemies are hungry feed them..."

Wait! What?!? It's one thing to pray for my enemies; and while it may be a stretch to bless them, I can do both of those things with little cost or threat to myself or well-being. But to feed my enemy?!? To keep my enemy alive?!? If that's what love requires, then love is asking too much!

Ah! But Paul seems to be giving me a way out of my dilemma. He says, when I do this for my enemy, I am heaping burning coals on their heads. Now that's more like it!

But wait. That is not how the early church understood Paul's words. Origin, one of the early teachers in the church saw the coals, not as a source of judgement, but a means of warmth; they were there to give warmth - "Let the enemy be softened by the fire of charity," he wrote.

We are called to an odd way of living. May we be odd in the way Paul envisions.


