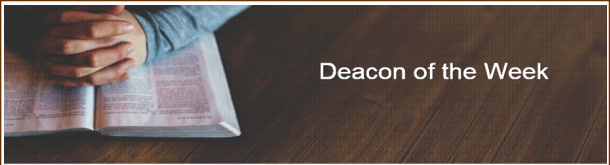

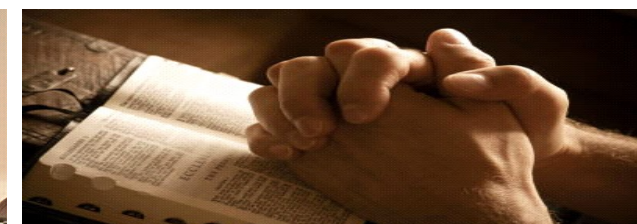
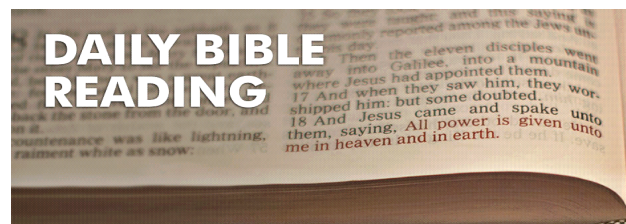
You will find collection baskets on the second floor near the entrance to the Sanctuary and on the first floor outside of the Church Office.
