A local colleague began an article she wrote for *GoodFaith Media* this way: "I love being a Baptist, because being Baptist is all about freedom . . . "

While I have no quarrel with the notion that Baptists have been leading proponents, in the religious, political, and social spheres, for things like freedom of conscience, freedom of religion, freedom from oppression, political and economic freedom, and the freedom of each individual to be who God created them to be; I do get a little concerned when we make freedom the primary good.

Unrestrained freedom can lead not only to chaos, but to real harm to persons and groups. If we are operating under the notion that we are free to do whatever we want to do, and that no one can question us or tell us otherwise, then we have entered the wild west of morality and behavior where the only limit on individual or group behavior is the wants and desires of the individual or group.

It is to that abuse of freedom, that distortion of the role freedom plays in the life of the believer and the church that Paul addresses in 1 Corinthians 8:1-13 (this week's Epistle reading). While Paul does not deny the freedom of every believer to follow the call of God on their own life, he pleads with the Corinthians to not make freedom their primary good, or principle value. He urges them to consider how their actions and decisions will impact the faith of others. I would imagine if Paul wrote to a bund of 21st Century Baptists, we might find ourselves chafing under his counsel.

For early Baptists, freedom was not an end to itself. Freedom was a means through which persons could authentically profess Jesus Christ as Lord. Free from the coercion of the state, Christians could follow the call of Christ according to the Scriptures and the leading of the Holy Spirit. We were all about freedom for all, not so we could do whatever we felt like doing, without restraint; but so that we could listen to God's voice and follow it as best we understand it.

Being a Baptist is all about following Jesus, freely and without coercion. The freedom we advocate serves that end.


