slavery and its lingering effects on Black Americans, or very real impact of the genocide, land-theft, and broken promises that continues to plague the ancestors of the people who were on this continent before Europeans began to conquer, colonize, and settle here.

Why is it fair that God should let those who benefit from the sins of their fathers and mothers get off 'scot-free' while others continue to suffer the ongoing injustice resulting from those sins?

If this is what God is saying, then I confess that would probably be joining the people in their protest. But is that what God is saying? That one generation can sin against one group of people in such a away that it keeps them enslaved or disadvantaged for generations to come, and that the children of the first generation bear no burden of responsibility?

I have heard people argue that they/we bear no responsibility for righting the wrongs of our ancestors by quoting the words of this passage.

But is that what God is saying? As I read these words in light of the full prophetic tradition, I think not.

While, indeed, one generation passes away and another comes to the fore, injustice and harm can transcend the passing of generations. The persons who slaughtered the Native Americans and stole their land are long gone. But the injustice and harm remains. We cannot go back and undo what they did.

The question that faces us, is 'what are we going to do to remove/alleviate the ongoing injustice and suffering they caused. To the extent that we choose to ignore those questions, we have not turned away from the wickedness of our ancestors, and their sin becomes our sin, and we will pay for it.

How many times have we uttered those words. Life seems so unfair when people gain something we do not think they deserve. "Why should that person get a promotion/award/recognition?" we wail. "I've worked just as hard as they did!"

Or perhaps even more galling is when people do not get the punishment we think they deserve. "How does that old so-and-so keep getting by with that! It is just not fair!"

We want life to be fair. We want people to earn what they get. We want people to suffer for what they do wrong toward us. We even want the families of people who wrong us to suffer.

In our Old Testament Lesson for this Sunday (Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32) the people of God accuse God of not being fair. "The way of the Lord is unfair!" they cry.

Why do they level this charge against God?

The passage begins with God telling Ezekiel to stop repeating the proverb, "The parents have eaten sour grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge." In other words, 'God will hold the children accountable for the sins of their parents.'



God goes onto to tell Ezekiel that each person will be judged, or held accountable for their own failures to live up to God's Covenant and will not be made to answer for the sins of their parents.

So, the people complain, "God is not fair!" They can look around and see that the parents/ancestors of some people have not suffered any consequences of their sins; in fact they seem to have prospered. So, who is going to pay for their sin? Certainly their children, right?!? That only seems fair that those who benefit from the sins of their parents should be punished.

Not only do the original perpetrators of the injustice/violence/transgression get away with it, but their children face no consequence for benefitting from their parents' sin. All the while the children of the original victims continue to suffer from the wrong done to their parents. Where is the justice in that?
