Monday through Wednesday of this past week, I had the privilege of joining with women and men for across the country in the 40th Anniversary Celebration of the founding of Baptist Women in Ministry (nee Southern Baptist Women in Ministry).

In March of 1983, 33 women gathered at Crescent Hill Baptist Church here in Louisville to create a network of support for women who felt called to ministry in local churches. In addition to providing encouragement to women who were already ordained and service, they set out to advocate for the inclusion of women in all aspects of church life and leadership, but especially in the pastoral ministry of the church.

During the course of anniversary celebration, we had the opportunity to hear the stories of the women, most of whom were in their mid-to-late 20 at the time, who came together 40 years ago to claim their call to ministry and challenge the notion that only men could be pastors.

One theme came through loud and clear as we listened to the stories they had to tell — most of them had spent time in GAs as young women. GAs and Acteens, they learned that God was calling all people in the church to go and spread the gospel to all nations, and they were encouraged to respond to the call of God in their lives. As they began to understand that their call to ministry was not to be a missionary overseas, but to serve in pastoral leadership within the local church, they found doors shutting, churches that had encouraged them to follow God's call saying, 'yeah, but not there,' and in too many cases they faced outright hostility and rejection.

The women who came together to found this movement were nothing short of courageous. The opposition they faced from many was fierce. Nancy Sehested

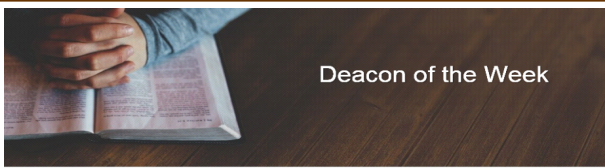

Jim's Jottings continued from Front Page and Susan Lockwood recalled having leaders of the Southern Baptist Convention labelling them as the “whore of Babylon” and the “spawn of Satan” respectively. As they tried to present their cause in state and national meetings of Baptists, every effort was made to silence them, e.g. cutting off mics mid speech. Yet they persevered.

But perhaps most painful to many of them was not the attacks of those who opposed the idea of women in ministry, but the silence of those who had formerly encouraged them to hear and follow the call of God; the deafening silence of those who agreed with them but were afraid of the cost of supporting them.

It was good to be a part of this gathering. The women who gathered 40 years ago I count as friends—friends then and friends now. They are heroes and role models in my mind. When I hear them tell their story, I am humbled by their bold determination and their grace.
