



SHOEBOXES READY FOR DELIVERY!!!

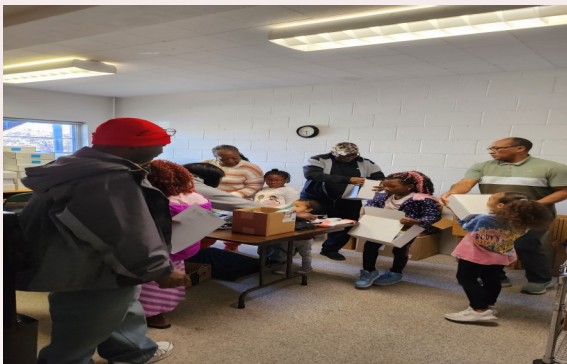

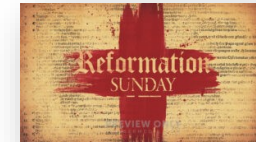

On October 31, 1517 Martin Luther nailed a document to the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Commonly known as *The 95 Theses*, this manuscript presented proposals for reforming the church. These proposals were intended to address what Martin Luther considered to be wholesale abuses of doctrine, ritual, church structure, pastoral care, etc. that were damaging, if not destructive to the lives of people who made up the church.

When Luther nailed this document to the church door, I don't think he intended to declare war on the church, nor did he seek to divide the church. Rather, he meant to begin a conversation about how the church could reform itself, bringing it closer to the community that Christ intended. Despite his best intentions, this call to conversation ignited a firestorm that led to his excommunication and to the splintering of the church in ways that Luther never envisioned nor intended.



One of the aspects of Luther's desire that often gets lost in all the hoopla about the five solas—scripture alone, Christ alone, faith alone, grace alone, glory to God alone—was Luther's profound skepticism about the about human wisdom. This led him to question whether one person—the Pope, or a small group of people—the Magisterium could be trusted with the authoritative interpretation of Scripture and the faith.

Luther contended that the Holy Spirit was as active in the congregation of the faithful as it was in the congregation of the Bishops and Cardinals. Therefore, the Scripture should be read and studied by the saints, who together discern the will of God. Even then, Luther counseled caution and humility, recognizing the limits and frailty of human wisdom and understanding.

As Baptist Christians we heard Luther very well at this point. In upholding the value of soul freedom and the autonomy of the local church, all long with the affirmation of the provisional nature of all human documents, we recognize that the church is always in need of being reformed as the body of Christ.

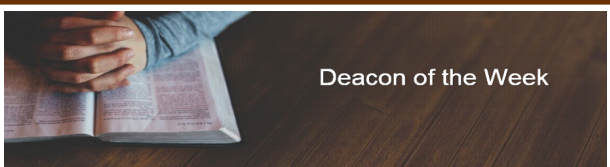

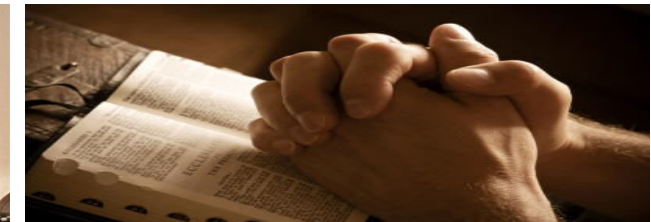
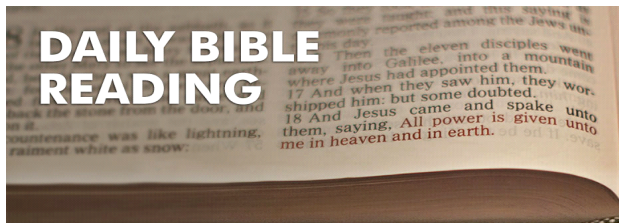
Every year on All Saints' Day, we gather for a special service to remember and honor those we have lost to death. We seek God's help and strength to cope with the loss and move toward healing.
