Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us. . . -Hebrews 12:1-2a

From October 31 to November 6, there is a Web Page lot of focus on the dead.

> In the Christian world, October 31 to November 2 have been set aside as days to honor those who have died. Though it has turned into a day of dressing up focusing on the macabre, Halloween, or All Hallows Eve,' was historically a day of prayer and preparation for All Saints Day on November 1 the day we honor those the Church has beatified as Saints, and All Souls Day on November 2—the day we remember all those who have died.



October 31—November 6. in Mexican culture is El Dia de los Muertos, The Day(s) of the Dead. During this festival, which has its origins in Mesoamerican ritual, European religion, and Spanish culture, it is believed that the border between the spirit world and the real world dissolves. The souls of the deceased come back into our world for a brief reunion with the living. Unlike the more solemn nature of All Saints or All Souls Day, the Day of the Dead is a festival, a joyful celebration of the ongoing bond between the living and the dead.

For many of us, who have grown up in the Western Christian tradition, both Halloween and El Dia de los Muertos seem more steeped in superstition and perhaps a threat to our understanding of the impermeable boundary between life and death, the living and the dead. This discomfort has led many Christians to see participating in Halloween activities as a violation of the Christian faith.

I confess that I have moved from a more absolutist to a more agnostic position when it comes to the nature of the connection between heaven and earth. I used to believe that the barrier is thick and solid, with no possibility of communion between the two. However, I cannot get away from the words above from Hebrews—"we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses." Do we gain strength from them only by remembering their faithfulness? Or is there some connection remaining between them and us? Do these witnesses engage in some type of intercessory ministry on our behalf? Perhaps life is truly more of a mystery than we can imagine; that in Jesus the boundary between heaven and earth becomes ever thinner?
