God is sending a warning to God's people: "Do not wait until the Day of the Lord for things to be set right. If you do, you will be caught up in the darkness and destruction of God's judgement. Instead get busy insuring that justice, equity, and right relationships within the human community are being pursed by you."

Three times in the fifth chapter of Amos, the prophet calls out, "Seek, the Lord and live!" That call is followed either by a warning to avoid idolatry or to engage in the kind of living that expresses God's desire for peace, for shalom to break forth, not only among God's people, but in the world. It is followed by a plea for the people of God to remember their calling to be the emissaries, the messengers of God's peace to all people.

We cannot sit and wait for Jesus to come back and make everything right. We have been called to engage in that work right here and right now.

The bulk of Amos 5 is God's lament over the failure of God's people to live into their calling. Rather than being beacons of God's desire for the human community, God's people have become just like everybody else in the world. They have worshipped at the altars of other gods. They have turned against those who speak God's truth. They have stolen from the poor to enrich themselves, and have pushed aside the needs of the poor in pursuit of the things they do not need.

God calls on the people not only to "seek good and not evil," but to "hate evil, love good, and establish justice. . . "

Recently I saw a video clip of Franklin Graham in which he is intoning, "Do you think the world is going to get better? No the world only going to get worse before the Lord returns." He is one of a good number of Christians who believe that we can do nothing to make the world a better place; that all we can do is wait for Jesus to return and set everything aright.

Through the prophet Amos, God tells the people that is misguided way of looking at things: "Woe to you who desire the day of the Lord! Why do you

want the day of the Lord?" Indeed why would any people who are not now engaged in enacting justice for the poor and devalued persons in our world look forward to a day when God will lift them up?

As I read Amos 5, I am reminded of the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. When all is said and done, the Rich Man winds up in Hades, while Lazarus rests in the bosom of Abraham. "Woe to you who desire the day of the Lord!"

Or I recall Jesus' discussion of the Last Judgment in Matthew 15—those who lived their lives ignoring the plight of the poor and the oppressed find themselves on the wrong side of God's judgement, cast into eternal punishment.


