Jim's Jottings

Christ the King Sunday marks the end of the Christian Year and celebrates the lordship of Jesus Christ over all creation.

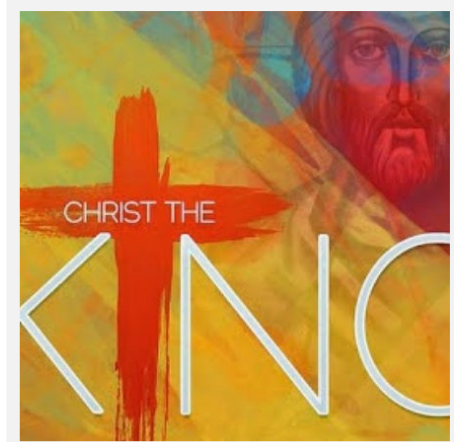
Established in 1925 by Pope Pius XI, the establishment of *The Feast of Christ the King* was designed to counter the growing secularization of society. Pius XI hoped to counter this rapidly growing trend by calling on all governments and institutions to submit to Christ; i.e. he hoped to re-establish the long-faded notion of Christendom, where God rules the world through the church.

In more recent times, the emphasis of Christ the King Sunday has shifted from a desire to re-impose Christendom on the world order, to an emphasis on looking forward to the return of Jesus and the fulfilling of the petition, "Your Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Therefore, the observance of Christ the King Sunday, standing as it does on the cusp of Advent, calls us to look forward to the time when, "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he will reign forever and ever."

[Revelation 11:15]

One of the earliest Christian professions of faith was, "Jesus Christ is Lord." That very profession located Jesus as ruler over the affairs of those who made that profession. You will notice that the profession was not, 'Jesus Christ is a Lord', but simply that Jesus Christ is Lord. To make that profession in the early life of the church was to set the Christian community over against all other rulers and authorities and to acknowledge that only God, through Christ, is the legitimate ruler over the human family; that Christians will not give their ultimate loyalty to any lesser ruler, human or spiritual.

On this Sunday, we are called to remember that we have made a profession of faith, of loyalty to Jesus. We have named him not only as Savior, but as Lord, and we will submit our wills to the one who is "King of kings and Lord of lords."

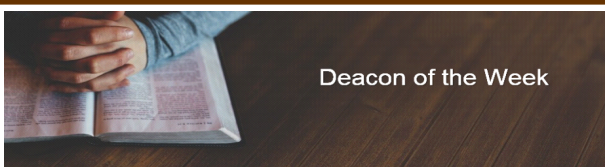

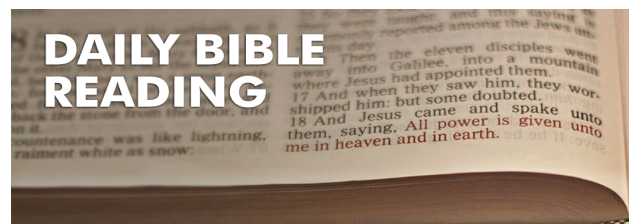
