"... our civil rights have no dependence on our religious opinions any more than our opinions in physics or geometry, "

-from The Virginia Statue for Religious Freedom, 1785

This week Ruth and I are making our occasional pilgrimage to the Williamsburg-Yorktown-Jamestown region of Virginia. Besides being a beautiful, restful place to be this time of year, the area gives us an opportunity to reflect on the struggles, successes, and failures of those who sought to give birth the this nation. I am always amazed at the outsized role that Virginians played in the formation of the United States.

One of those persons was Thomas Jefferson, who most of us connect with writing *Declaration of Independence;* but as Baptists, we should honor as one of the early advocates for religious liberty and the separation of church and state.

In 1779, Jefferson proposed to the Virginia legislature a bill entitled, "The Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom." No action was taken on his proposed bill until 1784, after Patrick Henry introduced "A Bill establishing a Provision for Teachers of the Christian Religion." This led James Madison to do two things. First he penned his famous, "Memorial and Remonstrance against Religious Assessments." Then moved Jefferson's bill for consideration by the legislature, where it passed handily, effectively disestablishing not only the Anglican Church, but Christianity from any position of privilege in Virginia.

In addition to the statement above, this piece of legislation also argues that: "the proscribing any citizen as unworthy the public confidence, by laying upon him an incapacity of being called to offices of trust and emolument, unless he profess or renounce this or that religious opinion, is depriving him injuriously of those privileges and advantages, to which, in common with his fellow citizens, he has a natural right, [and] . . . it tends only to corrupt the principles of that very Religion it is meant to encourage, by bribing with a monopoly of worldly honours and emoluments those who will externally profess and conform to it."

Most historians acknowledge that the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom provided the foundation for the adoption of The First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.






