I think a clue is found in Paul's opening words to them, when he gives thanks for them: "I give thanks to my God always for you, because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus . . . " While he may not find much to be grateful for in their current state, Paul knows that God's grace has been given them. That's enough.

Without a doubt, the church in Corinth created major headaches for the Apostle Paul. In the Corinthian church, Paul saw so much potential for good, so much possibility for them to become a model Christian community -- a model that would strengthen the churches, not only in Greece, but throughout the world.

Yet here they are, mired down in conflicts big and small. They argued over who was more spiritual, whose gifts were more important. They could not seem to leave behind them the social distinctions of the culture around them and live into the full egalitarian nature of a community made up of disciples of Jesus Christ.

In both letters to the church we have in our Bibles, we hear Paul pleading, cajoling, arguing, and almost demanding in his efforts to end the conflicts and help this church to get back on track.



I have long been fascinated with Paul's struggle with the Corinthian church. In these letters, we see the full passion and humanity of Paul. We come in contact with his pastoral heart,

passion and humanity of Paul. We come in contact with his pastoral heart, a heart that breaks, that gets angry, that overflows with love and longing.

Being in the middle of church strife and conflict is hard, especially when some of the focus of the conflict is on you and your role in the congregation. It is hard, as a leader in the congregation to deal with the flood of emotions that come when one is under attack, fairly or unfairly. It is hard to maintain an even spirit when you see some persons destroying or undermining the fabric of the community.

That is why I find Paul's reactions and struggles so instructive and challenging. Somehow, he is able to keep his focus on the bigger picture and not get totally
