Jim's Jottings



"Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though in the form of God, . . . humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death -- even death on a cross."

--The Apostle Paul, in Philippians 2:1--8

In today's epistle lesson from Philippians 2, Paul pleads for the church to be of "the same mind," "the same love," "one accord," and "one mind." Lest we misunderstand what Paul is getting at, he quotes what many consider to be an early hymn of the church that celebrates the self-giving love of Jesus and calls us to emulate his character.

The story in Genesis 3 of Adam, Eve, the snake and the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, points to what many biblical interpreters see as the basic character flaw (a.k.a. Sin) that afflicts humanity: we are dissatisfied with our status as beings created in the image of God, and we strive to elevate ourselves to God's station. In his incarnation, Jesus effectively reverses human striving to be God.

Not only does Jesus take on human form, but he takes upon himself, fully and without reservation, the human vocation to be servants, stewards of God in this world. New Testament scholar N. T. Wright suggests that the basic human vocation, the role that God gave humanity in this world is to be "the image-bearers of God in creation." In his incarnation, Jesus reveals to us our true nature; he demonstrates to us our proper humanity, our proper relationship to God and to each other, and our role in God's creation.

In his humanity, Paul asserts that Jesus "humbled himself." In humbling himself, Jesus "became obedient" even to the point of death on a cross. He gave himself completely into the Father's hands and submitted fully to the will of the Father. One can hear the echoes of Jesus' prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, "My Father, . . . not what I want but what you want."

This is the mind that Paul admonishes us to develop. One crucial point: Paul is speaking to the church. The verb Paul uses is both plural and imperative. The church is to develop the mindset of Christ Jesus in our midst. As a community of Christ, we are to be reflections of redeemed humanity that takes up our proper vocation as image bearers of Christ in this world.

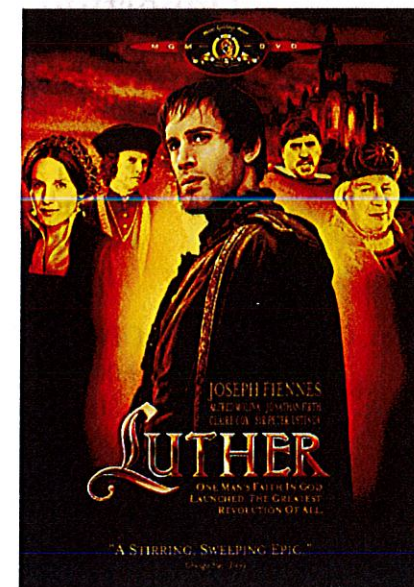

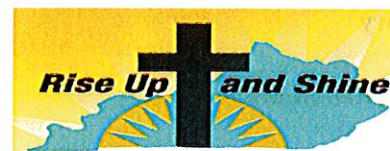

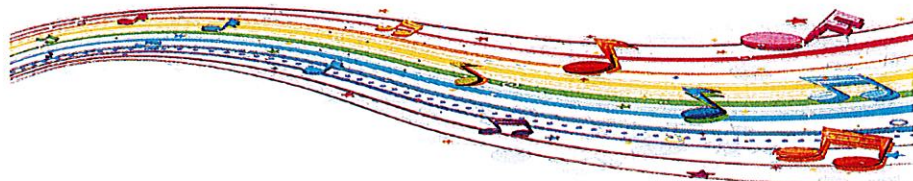
