
In 1991, Rodney King was brutally beaten by four Los Angeles Police officers during his arrest following a car chase through the city. The officers were charged with excessive use of force. Their acquittal on the charges in 1992 sparked the six-day Los Angeles Riots. Curing the middle of the riots, Rodney King went on television and asked, "Can we all just get along?" A version of his question, 'why can't we all just get along?' comes from out lips often in the midst of our contentious world.

We long for "world peace." We long for peace in our community. We long for peace in our state, in our nation. We long for all people to be able to "just get along."

The prophet Jeremiah recognized our longing for peace, daring to confront our false notions and visions of peace: "They have treated the wound of my people carelessly, crying, 'peace, peace,' when there is no peace.'" (Jeremiah 6:14) Jesus laments our lack of awareness of what it actually takes to achieve "world peace": "If you had only recognized this day the things that make for peace." (Luke 19:42)

Long-time Baptist journalist Walker Knight wrote a poem God's peace and what it takes to achieve it, that goes in part:

Peace, like war, is waged. Peace marshals its forces and storms the gates. Peace, like war, is waged. Peace gathers its weapons and pierces the defense. Peace, like war, is waged. But Christ has turned it all around: the weapons of peace are love, joy, goodness, longsuffering; the arms of peace are justice, truth, patience, prayer; the strategy of peace brings safety, welfare, happiness; the forces of peace are the sons and daughters of God.



To them, God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory! Colossians 1:27 As one popular saying in Nigeria, "my gratitude has no end." How can I sum up my two years in the United States without mentioning Lyndon Baptist Church, it is impossible! A church that gives more than just physical presence but in all ways is a blessing. You all have immeasurably contributed to my life in such a way, I can't forget. Four semesters with my extended family here in the States, is amazing.
